PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

December 1, 2013

Every year thoughts of Christmas magic fill my mind and soul. For most of my life, I have been looking for that perfect Christmas experience; you know the one where Bing Crosby is sitting in his high back chair with pipe in hand; framed by a larger than life stone fireplace with Christmas cards neatly displayed on the mantle, a fire softly burning in the background while he sings those beautiful Christmas melodies.

Every year I promise myself not to get caught up in the commercialization of Christmas sincerely vowing to avoid the malls and "Best Sale of the Year" sales pitches that lure me into spending money on dream toys for my children versus giving canned foods and non-perishable items to a food bank, or new toys to children who need them.

Every year I am perplexed at how one holiday can bring families together that haven't seen or socialized with each other for the other 365 days of the year. Family gatherings can become an expectation to fulfill instead of a genuine time of catching up on the joys and concerns of life that affect us all.

In other words, the "Most Wonderful Day of the Year" can become overwhelming, costly, stressful, and obligatory. All of the things that the birth of Christ "the Word made flesh" contradicted in the natural order of Creation. Since the beginning of oral stories God has advised us to take "only what we can use for that day" thereby avoiding the survival instinct of hoarding in order to feel peaceful about our futures. If each of us followed the example of collecting food on a day to day basis the concept of sharing and all of creation having enough to survive life would take on a different meaning. I especially love the way this story ends, if the people collected more food than they could use in one day the food spoiled by morning. In my imagination, I see tent cities popping up in grocery store parking lots just thinking about this plan of action.

What if we purchased only three gifts for our children to represent the three gifts that the holy men gave to baby Jesus? What if then we had the means to purchase three gifts for another child who like Jesus didn't have the economic advantages that most of us enjoy? What would it mean to have a community (family) who loves you for who you are; enjoys spending more than one day a year with you; and is genuinely concerned about your joys and concerns for 365 days of the year?

In theory, if those things were true, we might have to re-write our sacred Christmas songs from "It's The Most Wonderful Day of the year" to "Every day Is Wonderful." Maybe the song, "I'll Be Home for Christmas" could reflect the desire of "I'll Be Home More Often" because "you can count on me."

In the end, maybe the drama that we crave from other people's lives, "The Biggest Loser"; "Housewives of Beverly Hills"; "Survivor"; "The Amazing Race" could instead become a time of healing for our own lives, building daily relationships in love, not drama. Maybe instead of our culture's commercialization of the Hope, Joy, Love, and Peace of Christmas, we could instead picture ourselves kneeling at the side of a manger staring at all of the possibilities of a new life. Now that is a pleasant Christmas picture. Be born anew this day and...
