Dear friends in Christ,

It is 5 degrees and blustery, and we are enduring the usual Wisconsin winter trudge. Yet, I have fond memories of my father's mid-winter gardening instincts, reflecting his earthy spirituality. This time of the year he would study the "seed" catalogue and draw up his plan for the summer growing season. Pop tediously calculated and plotted out this garden-to-be and then, in an expression of joyful anticipation, mailed in the annual Burpee Company seed order. In dormant times God calls us to prepare to plant seeds. The Apostle Paul reminds us that if we resist fatigue - if we reject despair, cynicism and endless bemoaning - our energy can point to a new harvest. A re-imagined Church!

Today I share with you a new vision for our Conference Staffing. Four years ago, we made significant cuts in our "field staff" - downsizing from four Association Ministers to two Associate Conference Ministers (North and South). It is abundantly clear to me that this paradigm is unsustainable if we are to prioritize the care, connection and resourcing needs of our clergy and congregations. I have proposed, and the Board of Directors has enthusiastically endorsed, a plan for three Associate Conference Ministers in addition to the fieldwork I plan to take on. Here are some details:

Northwest Association - We will call a new Associate Conference Minister for the Northwest (60 congregations). Additionally, this person will be responsible for the development of small-church ministry models and strategies, as well as spiritual formation resources for the entire Conference.

Southwest Association - I have asked Rev. Joanne Thomson to serve as the Associate Conference Minister in the Southwest (50 congregations). She will also continue to develop and facilitate our *Communities of Practice* program and consult with our staff on issues related to congregational/clergy wellness and growth.

Northeast and Southeast Associations - I am referring to these Associations together as the *Eastern Corridor*. We intend to call a new Associate Conference Minister for this region, which consists of 112 congregations, though is relatively compact in geography. Since this ACM will serve two Associations, he/she will have fewer additional responsibilities, and I will assist this region with congregational care and transitional support as needed.

I'm thrilled to share the news that we have a fine Search Team in place, and we are prepared to launch these nation-wide searches for the Northwest and Eastern Corridor on March 1. We invite any clergy in good UCC standing, with pastoral experience in the local church, to consider submitting a profile. Applications will be received from March 1 to May 1. These Associate Conference Ministers will be expected to live within the region they serve.

Rest assured, we are formalizing a plan of leadership for the important *Church Development and Renewal* work that Joanne Thomson has so diligently guided. We are exploring some new models for carrying out the crucial need for coaching and resourcing local clergy and congregations on organizational leadership, strategic planning and spiritual vitality.

Finally, let me offer a quick word about my Installation. Since we convened as a Conference in November for the purpose of extending the Conference Minister Call, I have proposed to the Board that we fold an Installation Celebration into our Annual Meeting in June. My hope is to share in a wider *Litany of Celebration and Thanksgiving*, recognizing the faithful interim work of Rev. Kent Ulery and Rev. Becky Johnston, and potentially announcing our newly called Associate Conference Ministers. In the meantime - for the "ecclesiastically minded" among us - the Board of Directors and Conference Staff will share in a simple Installation Ceremony and luncheon at the Trost Center on March 2. This will be a wonderful opportunity to engage the Board (responsible for our Mission) and the Staff (responsible for our Ministry) in valuable time together.
