Pastor's Ponderings...

January, 2016

I have to admit that during these winter months with longer nights and cooler temperatures the natural animal instinct of hibernation is appealing to me. The season of Thanksgiving ushered in the opportunity of filling my belly with all sorts of good food while reflecting on the realization that I am a blessed person. The Christmas season renewed my Spirit of hope with the miraculous gift of love among us in the most vulnerable form of life, that of a baby. The holidays point us to expressions of life in function and form such as a child crying out when it is hungry for a caretaker to fill its belly and then watching that child relax into a time of rest, renewal, and eventual growth. It is a repetitive cycle of new life; anticipated needs; and rest.

I wonder if our relationship with God was born out of that same repetitive cycle? It seems that we are happy to live life on our own until a need arises and then we find ourselves turning to God for help. Our reaching out to God reminds us that at our core we are in need of something that is more powerful than our human capabilities. We awaken the divine within us from hibernation and realize that our spiritual belly is empty. In hibernation our God-stores have not been replenished and therefore we find ourselves in need of stability; peace; and reassurance that we are not alone.

So we begin to pray, or we attend worship services and the word of God feeds our spirit until we are once again filled with love and assurance and we can relax enough to fall asleep. Asleep until our next need wakes us up again to the notion that we need God in our life. So I wonder, "what if?" Could that normative human-spirit cycle be improved, the one that has convinced us that we don't need God on a daily basis which leads to us feeling void of God until we seek God's presence through prayers or worship attendance until we are comfortable enough to hibernate again?

I think the cycle can be changed but it will take practice on our part. What if daily acknowledging God's importance in our lives were as routine as brushing our teeth; or watching T.V.; or reading a book? What if God could be such an active partner in our day that we never hibernate from God's presence? What if we began a daily prayer practice; or a daily devotional time with God? What if, just like any new practice, we started with 5 minutes a day and then increased our daily time with God over a week then a month then maybe even the whole year? By recognizing that God never leaves us could we stabilize our stores of God's love in such a way that any "outof-the-Blue" crisis could be met with a personal assurance that God is present with us in that very moment, so present with us that we don't feel like we have to come out of hibernation to petition God for help?

During our worship time in the month of January we will be exploring and learning about different prayer practices and how we can make them an important part of our daily routine. I invite you during these long nights and cold days at the beginning of a new year to carve out time for a deeply personal relationship with the Almighty who never hibernates from our daily lives. Can you make it a daily practice in 2016 to intentionally spend quality time with God? Now is a perfect time to try.
