# The top ten reasons men should join the church choir:

10. Rehearsals are every Wednesday night. Which means that for those few hours, you will significantly reduce your risk of contracting tendinitis from nonstop operation of a television remote control or

computer mouse.

- 9. Because you wear a choir robe every Sunday, you are liberated from a task many men find quite challenging: finding clothes that match properly.
- 8. From your special vantage point every Sunday, in which you look out at the entire congregation from the choir seats, you will develop interesting new hobbies. Among these is a little guessing game called "Who's Praying, Who's Sleeping?"

#### TRUSTEES:

- The asphalt project is now completed.
- Lukas Jensen will check to see when the boiler project will be started.
- The boiler project will cost approximately \$25,000. Funding for the project will be divided as follows: Fund raisers = approximately \$8,200 (by Nov. 12); approximately 1/3 will come from the Porter donation; 1/3 will come from the Capital Fund, and \$650 from the Memorial Fund (donated by Elsie Arnold).
