

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES Monday, February 12, 2018 7:00 p.m. - 8:35 p.m.

PRESENT: Lukas Jensen, Julie Norland, Rev. Lora Whitten, Tracy Tronnes, Norma Thompson, Holly Gould (rep. Diaconate), Erin Smerchek and Bruce Morris

ABSENT:

CALL TO ORDER: Julie Norland called the meeting to order and Erin Smerchek led us in prayer.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Julie Norland entertained a motion to approve the Council minutes of January 8, 2018. Erin Smerchek made a motion to approve the council minutes and Tracy Tronnes seconded the motion. Vote taken. Motion carries.

MINISTER'S REPORT:

Rev. Lora distributed a "to do" list to the Council identifying what she currently does on a weekly basis.

As Rev. Lora acted as custodian for the church, Cal Wiersma volunteered to take over custodial duties on a temporary basis. The Trustees are currently collecting applications for the custodian position. Interested individuals will be interviewed in the near future.

Rev. Lora contacted church clergy and funeral homes in Edgerton to let them know that she will be leaving the Edgerton Congregational United Church of Christ as of February 18, 2018.

Rev. Lora suggested that we might want to contact Rev. Luke Bocher, Evansville, WI who is a recently retired UCC pastor to serve as pulpit supply or as a temporary pastor. He is currently listed on the SW Association Pulpit Supply Listing dated January, 2018.

Rev. Lora indicated that Krista Kim will take over teaching the current confirmation class. Rev. Franz Rigert will confirm the class on May 20, 2018.

NEW BUSINESS:

Julie Norland entertained a motion to select a Vice Moderator to serve on the Council for one year. With Tracy Tronnes' approval, Holly Gould made a motion to select Tracy Tronnes and Erin Smerchek seconded the motion. Vote taken. Motion carries.

We discussed the upcoming Southwest Association 2018 Annual Meeting to be held on April 14, 2018, Verona, WI and also the WI Conference Annual meeting held June 7-10, 2018 in Green Lake, WI. These are meetings that Rev. Lora would normally attend. In March we will see if anyone is interested in attending these meetings.

Rev. Lora will provide Norma Thompson with an updated Share/Care List before she leaves. Per Rev. Lora, Diane Goodger will distribute mail to appropriate church representatives for handling. Rev. Lora will provide Diane Goodger with the password to access any e-mail forwarded to the church.

Erin/Joel Smerchek, along with other Trustees will open the church doors, turn on lights, etc. before the start of each Sunday service. Lock-up, etc. will need to be done after each service also. Rev. Lora will make sure that Laura Young knows how to operate the sound system before she leaves on February 18. Evan Riley also knows how to operate the sound system.

OLD BUSINESS:

Background checks are currently being done on Sunday School teachers. Diane Goodger will receive the results along with the bill.

The special service for Rev. Lora's last Sunday is set to go. A luncheon to celebrate Rev. Lora's transition to a new job will be held after the service scheduled on February 18, 2018.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

TRUSTEES:

Voting for a Chair and a person to take notes during the Trustee meetings has been delayed.

Per Lukas Jensen, getting boiler thermostats adjusted is still a work in progress.

Trustees are looking into updating some of the lighting fixtures in the church kitchen. A donor has offered to pay for the fixture updates.

Erin Smerchek found out that Deegan's Hardware Store in Edgerton disposes of old florescent lights for \$2.00 per light. Erin offered to take some old lights from the church to Deegan's Hardware Store for disposal. The church has an account set up with Deegan's Hardware Store and any charges can be billed to that account.

TREASURER:

Tracy Tronnes indicated January's operating budget is running at a slight loss. It was necessary to transfer \$3,000 from savings to checking to cover bills incurred.

Tracy will be on vacation for three weeks in April.

Tracy will handle cutting stipend checks to pay substitute ministers, etc. while the church is in the process of hiring a new minister.

DIACONATE:

Next Communion will be held on Sunday, March 4, 2018. Sonja Heiser, a retired authorized lay pastor (listed on the current Pulpit Supply List) will be doing our service along with Communion on March 4.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION:

Materials to be used by the kids during Easter service are located in Rev. Lora's office.

Scott Fry and Dawn Kastenmeier will not be available to teach Sunday school on February 18, 2018.

The last day of Sunday school is scheduled for May 20, 2018.

Early church service starts at 9:30 a.m. on Sunday, May 27, 2018.

Different church activities are being planned for the summer, such as: a summer game night, rental of the park pool along with a family picnic, etc.

PRELIMINARY THOUGHTS ON SEARCH PROCESS:

Rev. Joanne Thomson, SW Association Conference Minister conveyed to Julie Norland and Tracy Tronnes that the search process is usually a several month process. Rev. Thomson plans to attend our next Council meeting to be held on March 12, 2018.

A suggestion was made that both members and non-members of the church be eligible to participate in the process of hiring a new minister.

The next Council meeting is scheduled for Monday, March 12, 2018. It was suggested that a second meeting be scheduled in March to continue the discussion of hiring a part-time minister. Julie Norland will schedule that meeting.
