CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES Monday, August 13, 2018 7:00 p.m. - 7:55 p.m.

PRESENT: Lukas Jensen, Julie Norland, Norma Thompson, Krista Kim (rep. Deacons), Tracy Tronnes, and

Bruce Morris

ABSENT: Erin Smerchek

CALL TO ORDER: Julie Norland called the meeting to order and Tracy Tronnes led us in prayer.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Julie Norland entertained a motion to approve the Council minutes of June 11, 2018. Tracy Tronnes made a motion to approve the Council minutes with one revision and Lukas Jensen seconded the motion. Vote taken. Motion carries. (Reference to Scott Fry as purchasing the WIFI extender should be removed from the June 11, 2018 minutes.)

NEW BUSINESS:

Scott and Dawn Fry have ended their membership with the Edgerton Congregational United Church of Christ. Kim Jensen has asked that her church membership be reactivated. Julie Norland will e-mail Kim to confirm her request and then check with Joanne Thomson, Associate Conference Minister.

Julie Norland questioned when the appropriate time to confirm the church's membership head count is. She will check with the Conference.

Bruce Morris indicated that Rev. Lora gave the Council a list of responsibilities that need to be completed by the end of the year. He suggested that September would be a good time to review that list.

OLD BUSINESS:

Pastor Kay Krebs is available through the end of November to lead our church services. She will not be available the month of December. The Deacons will contact ministers from the Pulpit Supply List to see if anyone is available to do church services in December. Two people to possibly contact are: Rev. Phil Haslanger and Rev. Luke Bocher. A minister will be needed for December 2, 9, 16, 23, 24 (starting 4:00 or 4:30 p.m.), and 30. The kids may do their Christmas program on December 16.

Peanut processing will start in September. Air filters should be replaced in the air purifiers before this process starts.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

TRUSTEES:

A WIFI extender will be purchased by Lukas Jensen before the next Church Council meeting.

The Trustees are in the process of discussing carpet replacement in the church. It was suggested that the congregation be polled to see what type of floor covering they would like placed in the church.

Lukas Jensen will pursue getting quotes about the cost of purchasing parking lot sealant.

Lukas Jensen has gotten two quotes regarding tree removal. A tree on church property is in bad shape and needs to be cut down.

The Trustees plan to look over the church bell to make sure it is in good shape.

Todd, Tammy and Logan Campbell have returned from Montana and are, again, attending church services at the Congregational Church. Tammy is, again, serving as church janitor.

TREASURER:

Per Tracy Tronnes, the checkbook is in fairly good shape. Revenue was 70% of the budget through July. Approximately \$1,100 was raised from the bake sale/food cart held at the church during Edgerton's Heritage Days in July. Donations from church family covered expenses incurred for purchasing food, etc. served from the food cart, along with snow cones from the snow cone machine.

Laura Young, Music Director, indicated she would like to purchase some Christmas music. She will work with the Trustees for their approval to purchase this music. Laura will need to complete the appropriate paperwork to be reimbursed \$50 she paid to someone who sang during a Sunday service recently. She will work with the trustees on reimbursement.

PASTORAL SEARCH:

The Pastoral Search Committee completed the pastoral search profile package and it was distributed to Rev. Joanne Thomson, Associate Conf. Minister for review. The Pastoral Search Committee was given resumes for five potential candidates. Three of those potential candidates may be interviewed in the near future.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION:

The Christian Education Team is still looking for a person to help teach Sunday School.

Erin Smerchek is working with the city of Edgerton to come up with an appropriate Christmas decoration with lights that can be placed in the city's park on behalf of the Congregational Church. The cost of the Christmas decoration is approximately \$550-600. The kids have raised \$425 so far. There are likely other donors willing to pitch in to reach the necessary amount.
