

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES Monday, September 10, 2018 7:00 p.m. - 8:25 p.m.

PRESENT: Mary Lou Behring (Deacon Rep.), Erin Smerchek, Lukas Jensen, Julie Norland, Tracy Tronnes, and Bruce Morris

ABSENT: Norma Thompson

CALL TO ORDER: Julie Norland called the meeting to order and Lukas Jensen led us in prayer.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Julie Norland entertained a motion to approve the Council minutes of August 13, 2018. Tracy Tronnes made a motion to approve the Council minutes with one revision and Erin Smerchek seconded the motion. Vote taken. Motion carries. (Under Treasurer report change the sentence to read, "Revenue was 70% of the budget *through* July" in August 13, 2018 minutes.)

NEW BUSINESS:

Stewardship discussion: Julie Norland and Tracy have agreed to be on the Stewardship Team and Julie will find an additional member for the team.

The Council discussed the calendar for the remainder of 2018. The budgeting process will start in late October or early November. The Council should update the church rolls in October or November. Advent begins December 2. Regular church services will be held on Sunday, December 23 and Christmas Eve services will be held on December 24. Annual committee reports should be submitted the first week of January, 2019.

A motion was made by Erin Smerchek and seconded by Mary Lou Behring to have Todd Campbell fill the opening on the Trustees team (spot vacated by Scott Fry).

OLD BUSINESS:

The Council approved Kim Jensen's request to reactivate her church membership. Total funds raised during Tobacco Days was \$1,175. Thank you to Behrings for coordinating this fundraiser.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

TRUSTEES: Lukas Jensen reported that the Trustees discussed: sealing the church parking lot, scheduling a work day for this fall and potential compensation package for a new minister. The Trustees made an exception to the 2018 music budget and approved additional expenses.

TREASURER:

Our net income YTD is \$5,860. Our revenue is 75% of the budgeted amount for 2018 so we are slightly ahead of our income budget. The expenses are less than budgeted due to our temporary reduction of minister costs.

PASTORAL SEARCH:

The Pastoral Search Committee has a lead candidate with whom they have completed reference checks, a phone interview and in-person interview. A neutral pulpit visit will be scheduled soon with this candidate.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION:

Sunday School started on 9/9/2018. Connie Wiersma, Michelle Nimmer and Erin Smerchek have offered to teach Sunday School with the youth. This year the curriculum is focusing on parables and Bible stories. A book club for teens and adults will start in October.

Fundraising continues for a light display for the city's parade of lights in Central park. The youth expect to place a blessing box where the pine tree used to stand. Meeting adjourned.
