Attendance Report 9/1 - 31 9/8 - 34 9/15 - 26 9/22 - 28

Last Sunday we read a parable from the Gospel of Luke that is titled various ways. Some interpretations call the story we read, "The Parable of the Dishonest Manager" or the shrewd, clever or wise manager depending on interpretation. It is a good parable to begin Stewardship conversations. Americans are some of the most generous people in the world. Ireland gives away the most money, then the United States, new Zealand, Australia and Indonesia (The Borgen Project). Of all the states, Wisconsin is ranked forty-second in giving. Studies on giving demonstrate that people who are poor give away more of their disposable income than people who are rich. But to be fair, three percent of a million dollars is substantially more than three per cent of fifty thousand. In the parable of the dishonest, clever, shrewd or wise manager we learn we can grow spiritually when we understand the economics of those who know how to get ahead.

This year's Stewardship Campaign is about more than asking for money to finance the church budget. It is about intentionally learning to live, "The Way". "The Way" of Jesus is the theme of this year's stewardship drive. We are to consider how we can best use our gifts and skills in the life of this church, how to support the mission of the church beyond financial contributions, and to think about the Good News in our own lives.

Gratitude is the beginning point. Through gratitude we are more generous with ourselves as well as our financial contributions. Thank you to everyone who continues to post on our community gratitude journal in the sanctuary. We have so much to be thankful for.
