Pastor's Notes

One of the Christmas traditions I have enjoyed the past few years is giving a charitable gift in someone's name. This year, through Heifer Confucius credited with the saying, "If your plan is for one year, plant rice. If your plan is for ten years plant trees. If your plan is for one hundred years, educate children". I decided that I had enough hope for ten years and thus we planted trees. At the beginning of this new year, how much hope do we have as a church community? What does this hope empower us to do?

At the December Council meeting I shared that in 2018 in the United Church of Christ, eighty-five congregations closed their doors. Half of the congregations within the UCC worship with fifty people or less. The larger congregations seem to be holding their own but the fifty or less congregations, without a solid sense of mission are vulnerable. As we talked about this we began to wonder, what exactly is mission? When we purchase items for Gifts for Kids or bring in food for the food pantry at Edgerton Outreach, isn't that mission? Mission is also having a clear sense of worship style. It could be advertising our Sunday school program as welcoming for LGBTQ families. It could be bringing in an immigration lawyer and offering a series on what just immigration practices look like. It could even be putting solar panels on our roof. Mission is the Gospel reaching out for the care of neighbor, creation, and children – or the most vulnerable among us. How we do this at Edgerton Congregational is worthy of several conversations.

We are in a new reformation. In the same way that the church reformed dramatically five hundred years ago, it is reforming today. It will be less institutional, more movement instead of policy. But there Tradition. Richard Rohr has said that with each rebirth, Christianity becomes more inclusive and universal, as it was always meant to be.

Maybe your New Year's resolution can be attending an Adult Education class or a congregational meeting where can share our different perspectives on mission.
