**Dear Friends:** 

Grace and Peace to you as we begin Holy Week together. One of my friends recently sent me a meme especially appropriate for today. It said, "This is the Lentiest Lent I have ever Lented". This Lent has been about so much more than giving up chocolate. We have had to be intentional in recognizing God in this wilderness of a global pandemic. Theologically we are called to celebrate life, to preserve life, and to recognize God's presence even when death comes.

Henri Nouwen said it this way. "The resurrection does not solve our problems about dying and death. It is not the happy ending to our life's struggle, nor is it the big surprise that God has kept in store for us. No, the resurrection is the expression of God's faithfulness to Jesus and to all God's children. Through the resurrection, God has said to Jesus, "You are indeed my beloved Son, and my love is everlasting," and to us God has said, "You indeed are my beloved children, and my love is everlasting."

In attendance: Connie Wiersma, Tracy Tronnes, Bruce Morris, Mary Lou Behring, Holly Gould and Pastor

Connie called the meeting to order at 7:10 pm

Pastor Lori opened the meeting in prayer.

Minutes from January were approved (moved by Tracy Tronnes, seconded by Mary Lou)

Vice Moderator has been chosen by council. Holly Gould nominates Tracy Tronnes, seconded by Mary

Lou. Tracy Tronnes was selected after unanimous approval.

Pastor's Report

Maryon Range passed away. Service is postponed to a later date, possibly Spring.

Worship music—Karen is hoping to play the organ twice a month or one song per service. Continuing to promote congregational participation.

Ash Wednesday is at 6:30 pm Wednesday, February 26<sup>th</sup>, 2020. It will be family-friendly.

Administrative—when new committees are meeting, remember that everyone should begin with an

agenda, that someone should be recording what is talked about (minutes are taken) and sent to the office

### after the meeting.

#### Old Business

Discussed how great the windows look however the question to cover them arose. Tracy is getting samples of drapes and blinds if the decision to replace old drapes is made by Trustees. Old drapes would need to be mended if they are to be re-used.

Surveys are still being collected. The feedback is coming in slowly and remains positive. Summary will follow after the due date, this Sunday February 16<sup>th</sup>.

#### New Business

Responsibilities of church council need to be shared. Connie secured a copy of the official list and briefly reviewed for the group.

Bruce reminded us that we need to look at the membership list, last vetted in 2017. Pastor Lori will look for an up-to-date list so we can confirm who we should be paying conference our per person fee,

(Southwest Association dues). Mary Lou found a copy from 2018 and gave to Bruce. Pastor Lori will search old computer files (from Diane era) to see if there are 2019 numbers we can update with. A letter will be drafted by the moderator to send out to people who are considered inactive.

Tracy Tronnes would like to nominate Bruce Morris to fill the open Trustee position. The nomination was seconded by Mary Lou Behring. Unanimous approval of Bruce taking this role on.

Holly was asked to search out possible church daycare workers due to her connection at the high school. Connie proposes a progressive dinner in the near future.

#### **Committee Reports**

Diaconate—Tammy has the elements on March 1<sup>st</sup>. Bruce wonders if wine is something to consider to have as an option on communion Sundays. Pastor Lori says there is no rule about abstaining from alcohol, it is more about your church's tradition. It would be something to consider.

Christian Education—Connie says the valentine's Sunday deliveries were a big hit! Swifthaven was already having a party and the residents of the Care Center were happy to see the kids. Teachers are needed for Sunday School. Lenten Study will meet after church starting March 1<sup>st</sup>. They will be reading *Searching for Sundays.* 

Trustees—Bruce talked about the next phase of window replacement. The order would be office, office, nursery. He talked about a fundraiser which may be as simple as asking for donations. Curtains are also being discussed. He wonders if just going to Menard's might be the cheapest route because the windows are now a standard size making them less custom. The hydration station is in full operation in the kitchen. They are refillable from Woodman's. A second one is expected as a donation for the upstairs level.

Treasurer's Report—Tracy reports that Lori's pension contributions are up to date. The window and labor has been paid for. A donation was made by a church member that paid \$5000 towards the window. Meeting adjourned at 8:12 pm.
