What Do We Believe?

One of the great gifts of our current leadership process is asking questions about what is important to us and what we believe. I remember as a teenager being very frustrated that the churches my friends attended gave very clear guidelines for behavior. For example, I had a friend whose church said, "no dancing". This was a disappointing but clear rule. Another church explained why wine should never be used for communion. My church, Metamora Christian Union United Church of Christ gave no easy answers. Even though I was on the Conference Youth Ministry Team, easy answers were not to be had. In the UCC we have a statement of faith that summarizes what we tend to believe - but there is room for personal interpretation. Our beliefs come from studying the Bible with others seeking to know God better. We invite the Holy Spirit to be a part of the conversation. And we remember our own experiences of God's activity in our lives.

The Roman Catholic Church, Episcopalians and Anglicans are high church. This means they have clear stated beliefs, liturgy and are more creedal in nature. important. Low churches are non-creedal (though we have a great respect for ancient creeds), our liturgy and rituals are more fluid. Communion may look different on different Sundays. Low church traditions don't have a book of instructions to fall back on, just the Bible story. There is a continuum and this very brief explanation may not be very satisfactory but we in the UCC are usually more low church than high church. However, if a congregation came out of the Evangelical and Reformed tradition from the 1957 merger that created the UCC, they might have more "high church" practices. The Congregational Church of Edgerton United Church of Christ is very much congregational in nature.

Below is our statement of faith. The first one written in 1957 did not use inclusive language. This one has been adapted to be more inclusive in describing God.

United Church of Christ Statement of Faith adapted by Robert V. Moss

We believe in God, the Eternal Spirit, who is made known to us in Jesus our brother, and to whose deeds we testify:

God calls the worlds into being, creates

humankind in the divine image, and sets before us the ways of life and death.

God seeks in holy love to save all people from aimlessness and sin.

God judges all humanity and all nations by that will of righteousness declared through prophets and apostles.

In Jesus Christ, the man of Nazareth, our crucified and risen Lord, God has come to us and shared our common lot, conquering sin and death and reconciling the whole creation to its Creator.

God bestows upon us the Holy Spirit, creating and renewing the church of Jesus Christ, binding in covenant faithful people of all ages, tongues, and races.

God calls us into the church to accept the cost and joy of discipleship, to be servants in the service of the whole human family, to proclaim the gospel to all the world and resist the powers of evil, to share in Christ's baptism and eat at his table, to join him in his passion and victory. God promises to all who trust in the gospel forgiveness of sins and fullness of grace, courage in the struggle for justice and peace,the presence of the Holy Spirit in trial and rejoicing, and eternal life in that kingdom which has no end.

Blessing and honor, glory and power be unto God.


