from the desk of Rev. Kendell Nordstrom
One evening, while driving home after
attending a church conference, I asked
my delegate what he thought of the
meeting. "It felt like a political party at
prayer," he said. He was right. That's
exactly what it felt like. From that
moment on, I promised myself that
while I would always preach Christian
values, I would not use the pulpit to
advocate for political positions.

No more.

Gun control is one of the most controversial political issues facing the country, but I am no longer going to be silent, either from the pulpit, or in public. No 18-year-old should be legally allowed to buy two AR 15 rifles three days apart. We need to change.

I recently signed a petition sponsored by the Wisconsin Council of Churches calling for Common-Sense gun safety laws. They are advocating for:

- Universal background checks,
- Extreme risk protection orders,
- Community violence intervention funding, and
- A reasonable permitting process for carrying firearms.

The framers of this petition wrote, "It may seem like a small gesture, but we cannot be silent. Silence can be taken for consent to the status quo. Our faith leaders must speak up now and say, 'No more.'"

And so, I say, "No more." No more Uvalde, no more Buffalo.... Just, no
