### CHURCH COUNCIL

### Mon. SEPT 11, 2023

Present: Rev. Kendell, Connie Wiersma, Bruce Morris, Jill Sanderson, Josephine Navarro, Todd Campbell, Mary Lou Behring and Connie Tronnes. Connie called the meeting to order and Kendell had a moment of silence remembering 911, followed by prayer. The minutes from the last meeting were reviewed. Bruce moved to accept the minutes; Todd seconded it. Motion passed.

CONGREGATIONAL TIME: Josephine stated that the piano that is being donated by Holly Gould /Margret Hawkins will be moved to the church by Adam Gould and a friend in a few weeks. A discussion was had about moving the other piano downstairs. Josephine will take care of arranging that. She asked if the money we have raised toward a piano could be used to tune the new one before Christmas. She thinks a special thank you concert to the families would be a nice tribute as well as a nice note of thanks. Connie Tronnes asked about the outdated bibles in the pews. She is hoping to use some memorial money to buy new ones. Bruce will look into it. She also expressed interest in getting a screen for the front of the church as well as trying to bring in new members. These are things the council has been working on in hopes of some resolution soon.

MINISTERS REPORT: Kendell spoke of some great moments during worship. He is thankful for all the children being back for Sunday school and sharing children's message with them. Also, for the special music that will happen the 17<sup>th</sup>! Along with Kendell's last Sunday on Oct. 1<sup>st</sup> it will be Worldwide communion. We are in hopes of Rachel Bauman being with us for the Liturgy of release, if her duties allow it. If not someone else from the conference office will be here. Kendell is expecting the UCC to have special offerings for the disaster in Morrocco as well as a new respite program for dementia patients. There will also be special offerings for Neighbors in need as well as our obligation for our Jams student!

KATHLEEN/ COMMUNICATION: Kathleen stated she left the meals on wheels folder for us. She is hoping for a letter of transition from the council for Kendell in the next newsletter. She stated that it is hard to put out our call for new office staff when we are up in the air about an interim/settled pastor. Bruce suggested we line up pulpit supply for about 4 weeks out so we know we will have a pastor. Mary Lou will reach out to the conference for a recent supply list.

USHERS: There are sign up sheets up stairs for people to volunteer. Mary Lou will revise an usher duty list.

DIACONATE: Communion will remain the first Sunday of each month.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION: The first week of Sunday school was successful. Oct 8 there will be a special activity during class. There will be a water walk which will be a meaningful task to teach

about poor countries that do not have running water. The Christmas pageant will be held Dec. 17<sup>th</sup> during worship. Josephine will help with music.

TRUSTEES: Still looking into a tablet of some kind for our FB live. The carpeting on the front steps as well as the stairs coming in the front door will be moved up the needs list as they are progressively getting worse. The hedge project in front has been completed, still waiting on a bill. Tracy will speak with our neighbor at the Venue about the dumpster as well as other objects in our driveway.

TREASURES REPORT: Our income is ahead of budget. There was a budgeted transfer in August.
