Sunday, March 24 - 10:00 a.m. Palm Sunday Service Thursday, March 28 - 7:00 p.m. Maundy Thursday Service with communion

Friday, March 29 - 7:00 p.m. Good Friday Service with Edgerton United Methodist (Rev. Dan Witford preaching and reading of the scriptures)

Sunday, March 31st - 10:00 a.m. Easter Sunday Service

I would like to gather the choir to sing during Holy Week. We may have a soloist, duet, or a group of singers for any particular service. It would be great to have a choir sing on Easter Service! Whether you sang for the Metropolitan Choir or sing in the shower you are invited to come and join the group. Please bring along ideas for Holy Week music.

From the Search and Call Team

- The search and call team has been notified that Pastor Shawn Stapleton
 has taken another position with a hospice organization to supplement his
 income and is no longer a candidate for ministry with ECUCC. As
 disappointed as we might be, we are now positioned to have a better
 understanding of how this process would work (Shared Ministry) as well
 as how creative we might need to get in a time of changing church life.
- Many steps forward have been taken since the Spring of 2023 a team was formed, church profile created, and feedback gathered from the congregation. 6 profiles were received, and conversations began about the idea of shared ministry. A "coffee and conversations" listening session was held, and potential worship models were explored. The conversation will continue on March 10, after the demonstration of a virtual service concluding with a feedback session with church leadership.

CHURCH COUNCIL

January 8,2024

PRESENT: Connie Wiersma, Bruce Morris, Tracy Tronnes, Kathleen Matson, Mary Lou Behring and Jill Sanderson via video conference. Connie called the meeting to order. Kathleen shared an Epiphany devotional. The minutes from the last meeting were reviewed. Tracy made a motion to approve the minutes. Bruce seconded it. Motion carried.

MINISTERS REPORT: We need a list of possible folks that are interested in joining the church, or to learn more about us! Rev. Tiff is hoping to meet Tue. Jan 16 to gather names and set an agenda. Feb. 18 we are planning a homecoming Sunday! We would like to invite friends and members that have not been around for a while. A fellowship can follow service. Tiff shared a bible that would be appropriate to replace all the ones in the pews in the sanctuary. The price will reflect the number of bibles purchased. Mary Lou shared that there are around 40 bibles in the pews now. Tracy felt there are some areas we may not need them. After a discussion a decision was made to start this Sunday encouraging people to donate for the purchase of new ones. Kathleen will announce it in the weekly email and Tiff will announce it in worship. The monies can be put in the offering noting that it is for bibles. Tiff shared that he is interested in doing some visiting of shut-ins and will need names of folks that are interested. Lent is around the corner and we will need to decide what to do for a study and special services.

KATHLEEN/COMMUNICATIONS DIRECTOR: Kathleen stated that she is asking for more liturgists and ushers and greeters to sign up. We may have to approach people as no one is coming forward. We have our meals on wheels dates for the year. Kathleen will be the lead on this. We need to address the anniversary and birthday list. An absentee ballot will be printed for the votes on the annual report and will be handed out upon request. The annual reports are due now! The meeting will be held January 28th following worship, followed by a potluck in fellowship hall.

SEARCH AND CALL TEAM: A coffee and conversation time with Rev. Shawn Stapleton (a perspective shared ministry candidate) will be held in fellowship hall on Saturday Jan. 13th. On Sunday the 14th Rev. Shawn will preach the sermon as Rev. Tiff will be leading worship. We are hoping this will give folks a better feel of what a shared ministry will look like.

BUSINESS: It was brought to attention that the signage in the parking lot is very hard to read and needs replacing. Bruce will check into it.

WORSHIP LIFE TEAM: Communion is being served the first Sunday of each month. Baked goods and cards from the church were taken to 3 shut ins for Christmas.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION: Jill stated that the new CE team will be meeting the last Sunday of the month following worship.

TRUSTEES: Bruce shared that all but 2 very small windows have been replaced. All new exterior doors are planning to be replaced and due to cost will be voted on at the annual meeting for approval.

TREASURES REPORT: Tracy was very happy to announce that for the first time in awhile we ended up in the black!

Mary Lou made a motion to adjourn. Bruce seconded it. Motion carried.
