FEBRUARY THEME: RADICAL LOVE

From Director of Ministry & Education Jill Sanderson

What would it look like...and what might happen...if we offered Love as the answer to a world of peril? We say the words easily: *God is Love*. We teach them early: *Jesus called love the greatest of all our powers*.

And yet, so often we treat love as something fragile. We often treat love as a feeling that comes and goes, an emotion we fall into and fall out of, a soft idea reserved for safe spaces and easy relationships.

But the love Jesus embodied was never passive or fleeting.

It disrupted systems, crossed boundaries, restored dignity, and demanded courage. Love, in this vision, is not simply something we feel; *it is something we practice*. It is an orientation of the heart that shapes our choices, our relationships, our use of power, and our willingness to show up for one another. To live with radical love is to believe that love can still move the world. Love moves not through grand gestures alone, but through ordinary, daily acts of attention, courage, generosity, and care.

What might change in us, between us, and around us if love were not just our belief, but our response?

In February, our worship services will center on a practice of “Deep and Radical Love.” Together, we will reflect on what it means to love, as Jesus loved, fully, courageously, and without condition. Scripture is filled with stories of those considered untouchable. These were people living at the edges of, or even outside of, the community. Jesus reached toward these people. This month we’ll listen for how that same call speaks to us today. Who are the “untouchables” in our world or in our neighborhoods? Who are the “untouchables” in our own hearts? *What would it look like for our church to be a place where love is practiced so deeply that no one is left outside its reach?*

May February be a time when we let God's love stretch our hearts wider, deeper, and braver than ever before.

UCC LENTEN STUDY: “OUTGROW”

Led by Moderator Krista Kim, this continuing education opportunity will explore a daily devotional to guide us through the days of Lent, Maundy Thursday, Palm Sunday, and Easter. Each day includes a scripture reading, reflection and prayer, from the first day of Lent through Easter Sunday.

The group will meet at 6 PM for a soup supper followed by discussion at 6:30. Beginning on February 18 and meeting February 25, March 4, 11, 18 and 25 this six week study will invite you into the discipline of Lent, a season in which life's trials do not relent but neither does our growth in the Spirit.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

In February, our children will explore what it means to practice deep, radical love.

Through stories, play, art, and hands-on activities, children will learn that God's love comes close to us and is experienced through kindness, listening, sharing, and caring for one another.

Each week, we will focus on a different way love shows up:

- **God's Upside-Down Love:** Children will explore the idea that God doesn't measure importance by fame, power, or titles. Instead, God values gentle hearts, kindness, and everyday acts of love. (Things children are already very good at)
- **Being "Salt" in the World:** Using taste tests, stories, and art, children will learn that small actions can make a big difference. Just like salt brings out flavor, loving actions help make the world better.
- **Learning to Listen:** As we approach Lent, children will practice slowing down and listening to their bodies, to one another, and to the world around them. Through games, sound activities, and calming crafts, they'll discover that listening itself is an act of love.
- **Wilderness Adventure & Abundant Grace:** To begin Lent, children will go on a "wilderness adventure," learning that even when things feel unfamiliar or uncertain, there can be enough when people share and help one another. Together, they'll read Stone Soup, make soup as a class, and discover how abundance is created through community.

Throughout the month, children will engage in storytelling and picture books, cooperative games, simple crafts and sensory activities. All of our activities are practices designed to help them notice their feelings and care for others.

In our church, our goal is to help children experience faith as something safe, relational, and active. We're grateful to partner with you as your children grow in love, curiosity, and a sense of belonging.

TRY THIS AT HOME: PRAYER PROMPTS FOR RADICAL LOVE

Listening for Love that Changes Us

These prompts are designed to help us reflect on how Christ-shaped love shows up in our daily lives. Consider incorporating these reflections during your prayer practice to help us notice where love is needed most, and how we are called to respond with courage and care.

Show me where you are inviting me to love beyond safety

Help me notice where I resist - and meet me there with grace.

Open my eyes to those I have learned to overlook

Teach me to see them as you do.

When my capacity for love feels worn thin, meet me with rest instead of guilt.

Renew what has grown tired in me.

Thank you for the people who have shown me your love in unexpected ways.

Let their kindness continue to shape how I show up in the world.

Took a time of reflection for the past two years that we had the opportunity to have Rev. Tiff Bates be our interim pastor. Now we are fortunate to have Tiff and Lynn join our church and be part of our church family following his retirement. The minutes from the last meeting were reviewed. Jill made a motion to approve the minutes as written. Tracy seconded the motion. Motion was approved.
